

Principal Company is by invitation and audition only. This level of company requires a tremendous amount of commitment and hard work. Students must meet technical requirements by level, be willing to practice outside of class, and be held accountable for their personal progress. For these dancers, dance is their #1 activity above all others (sports, girl scouts, etc.). Teamwork is vital in this stage of dancing; you need to fully trust in your peers as well as hold your own weight. level where you will learn ultimately how to be responsible for



your work, learn time manage-

ment skills, support your fellow company members and where the level of success will solely depend on

the commitment of the team.

Dancers are required to compete a minimum of 2 competition routines, although most dancers elect to do more. Dancers will be placed in a weekly, level-appropriate Jazz and Tap technique only class. All routines will be cast and rehearsed on Sundays as specialty routines. Choreography will begin to be set during the required Summer Choreography Intensive August 14-18.

WHAT ARE THE SCHOOL YEAR CLASS COMMITMENTS (August-May)?

BALLET CLASS: 1-1,25 hour Ballet class (depending on age/level, advanced levels also require pointe)

JAZZ TECHNIQUE: 1-1.25 hour Jazz Tech class

TAP TECHNIQUE: 45min-1 hour Tap Technique (or Academy) Class

ELECTIVE CLASSES: If a dancer is cast in a Specialty Lyrical, Contemporary, Hip Hop or Musical Theatre Routine they must take a weekly class in that style. (Lyrical & Contemp=Lyrical, Hip Hop=Hip Hop, MT=Jazz)

WHAT ARE THE SUMMER CLASS COMMITMENTS?

Continued training is essential in the development of a dancer, Time "off" sets a dancer back, Principal Company dancers are required to maintain their minimum class requirements throughout the summer session (Ballet, Tap, Next Level Technique, & Rep). Principal Dancers in 4th-5th grade must log a minimum of 17.5 hours of weekly training throughout the summer, 6th-9th graders a minimum of 18.75 and 10th & up a minimum of 20. See summer info for details. Exceptions to this rule, including alternate training must be approved by the Company Director.

WHAT IS THE FINANCIAL COMMITMENT?

Monthly Admin Fee	\$10 per month per dancer (June 2023-May 2024)
Monthly Class Tuition	Minimum monthly tuition for the required classes based on the 2022-23 rate is \$207-\$249 per month. 2023-24 tuition rates have not yet been determined.
Specialty Routine Fees	Tuition: \$12-\$18 month/per routine Costume: \$95-\$105 per routine Entry Fee: \$192-\$205 per routine for 3 regional competitions
Nationals Entry Fees	\$0 (Summer 2024 is not a nationals year)
Company Make-up	Approximately \$35
Dance Shoes/Tights	Cost varies depending on needs of the costume
